Terminal 1 Construction Update

- Demolition of the existing structure has begun.
- Work continues on constructing two deep soil mixing work pads in the areas of the new trestles.
- Construction continuing for a new mooring facility in the North Extension.



Provided a third trestle for Matson operations

- Rehabilitated the West trestle for truck traffic.
- The trestle is designed for one-way traffic only.
- The following signage will be posted at each end of the trestle:
 - 5 MPH Construction Zone
 - One Way
 - Yield



First Permanent Piles Arrive



- The first barge of permanent piles arrived with the Wotan over the weekend.
- The pile barge is currently moored in front of the North Extension.



MMJV's Wotan Derrick Barge



- MMJV's largest derrick barge, the Wotan, arrived over the weekend. It is currently moored in MMJV's marine work area in front of POL1 and Terminal 1.
- The Wotan will begin driving pile in the next couple of weeks.

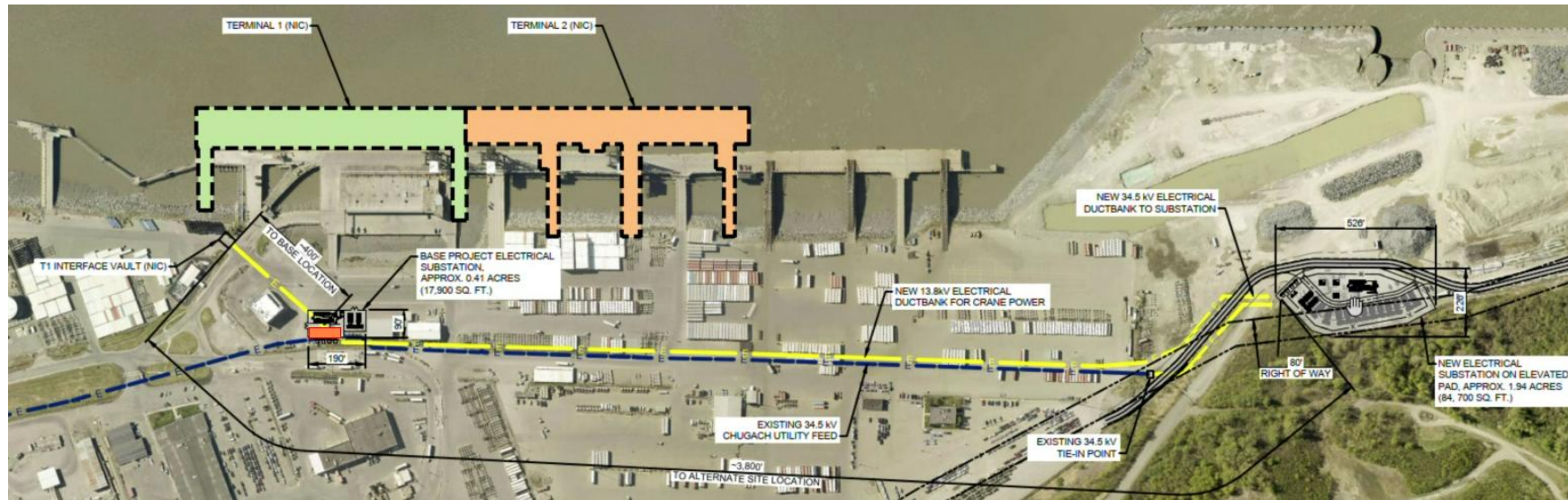


POL2 has been dredged to allow for fuel tankers



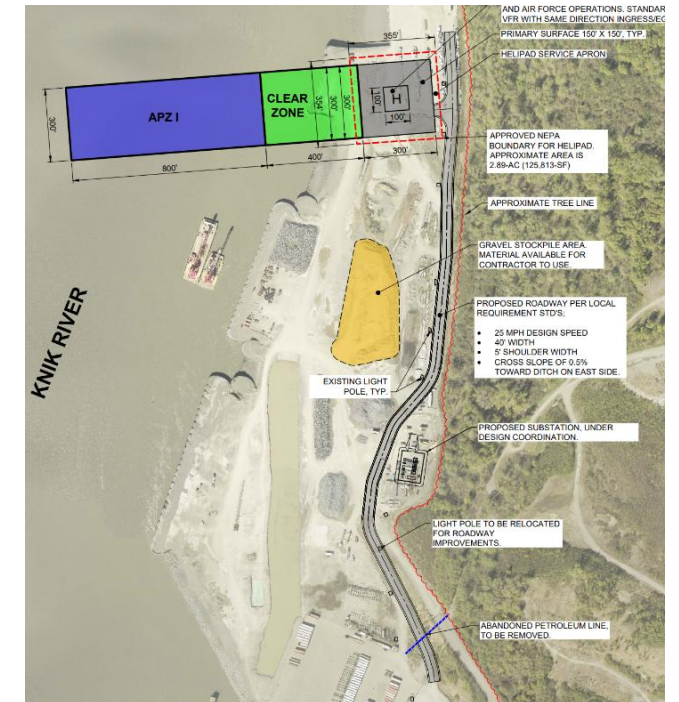
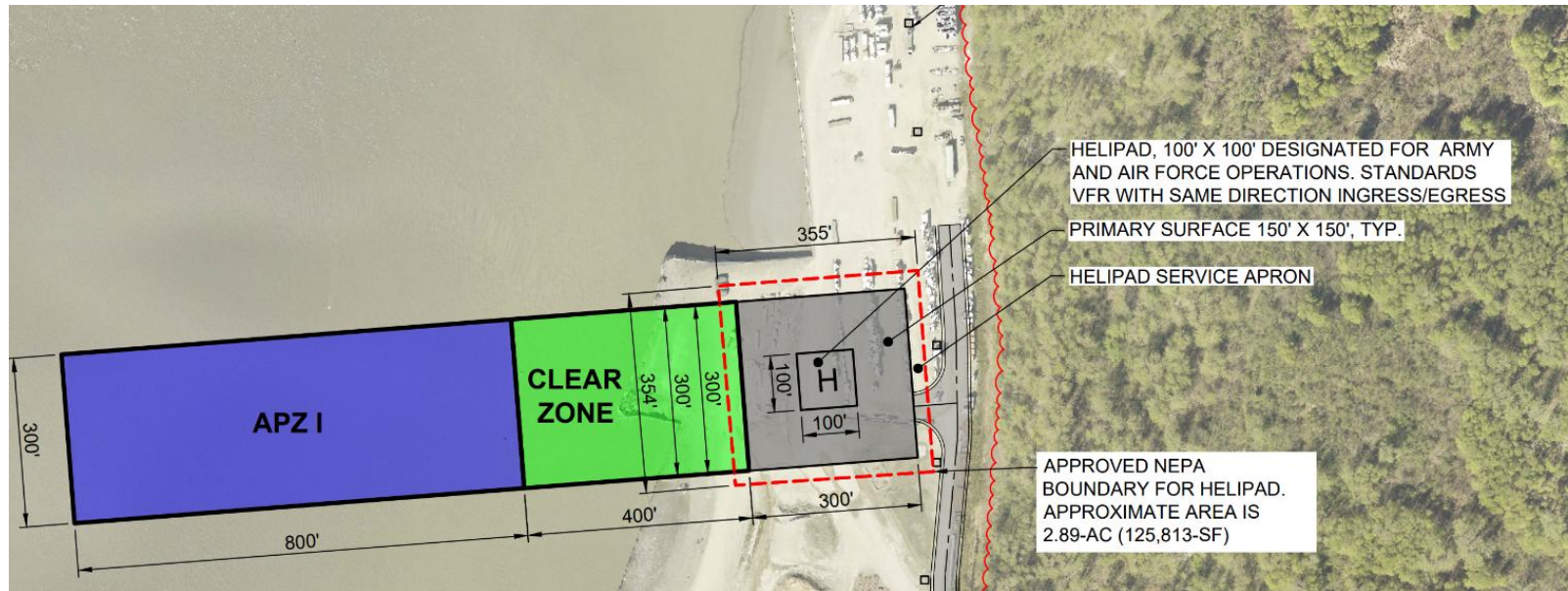
Electrical Substation Project - North Extension Location

- Construction anticipated to begin in July.
- Goal to construction duct bank this year and run cable next year.
- Currently working on the duct bank design



North Extension Helipad Project

- Procurement package is in review with Purchasing. Advertisement expected in late May.
- Construction will most likely be in 2027.



Terminal 2 Design

- Project design is ongoing
 - Sharing information learned from T1
- Study for an alternate fuel transfer facility during construction of the new Petroleum Terminal being updated
- Draft submittals due middle of September.
